

Personal word from Kristi Hobbs... What's in a Name?

Billy Hobbs and I made our first trip to Africa in February of 2003 with Sammy Tippit Ministries. It was then that we were introduced to a Kenyan couple who would serve as our guides, taking us to our ministry assignments each day. Whether it was to hospitals, or schools, or mental institutions, or churches, this couple led us as we presented Jesus throughout Nairobi. During those two weeks God knitted our four hearts together in a way that was unexplainable. After the first week, this couple told us that they wanted to give us African names, but since this is something of great significance they first wanted to pray about what to name us. The night before we left they presented us with this special gift. To Billy, they gave the name 'NJAMBA' which they explained was a heroic name meaning 'Warrior, Strong One.' I nodded in agreement with this obviously befitting name for my husband. They then turned to me and announced my name, 'MUMBI', which means, 'Creator, Giver of Life, Mother of Many.' I received it gratefully, but in my heart I was disappointed because first of all, I don't consider myself creative, and secondly, Billy and I had been married 14 years and had no children, so 'Creator, Giver of Life and Mother of Many' made no sense at all.

Fast forward five years. June of 2008 I stood in Africa on the property that the Mercy Foundation purchased two years earlier as the site of the 'JESUS. Hobbs House of Hope', the children's home established in memory of Billy 'Njamba' Hobbs. As I stood with a microphone at our dedication service surrounded by community leaders and the orphans who would be possible residents of this new home, the Lord reminded me of that day in February 2003 by gently whispering into my spirit, 'MUMBI!' I wept as I realized the significance of that name ... that prophetic name which made no sense five years prior. But on that day, as I looked into those little black, tear-stained faces, I knew beyond a doubt that this was my name and that these were my children. It may not make sense, but although I live half a world away, I feel like I am their mother ... a mother of many.

I am forever grateful to that couple for hearing from God and against reason, giving me that name. That couple was Peter and Jemimah Njao, who are the co-visionaries and African Directors of the Hobbs House of Hope Children's Home. God is amazing! I want to thank each of you for the investment you've made into the lives of my kids throughout the years! Merry Christmas.
