

IN DIRE NEED OF A SCHOOL AND KITCHEN

The House of Hope is facing exciting times as we look to expand. As our children grow and their numbers increase we are finding that this growth is outstripping our facilities.

We are in dire need of a new school building and a larger kitchen. Our current upper school consists of three classrooms that are really not classrooms but rather small rooms separated by wooden partitions, in what was originally intended to serve as our library. These partitioned rooms are too crowded and close together that the normal teaching noises from one room penetrate the other rooms, making it difficult for both teachers and students.

We have also exceeded the capabilities of our existing 20 x 10 kitchen that is now too small and lacking in adequate cooking and storage areas. (We have to store our food staples and supplies across the property in a storage closet located in the Missionary House.)

While our December newsletter will provide more details as to the vision of what we believe the Lord is calling us to do, it is clear that we NOW need to begin raising funds for our expansion. Thanks to your faithfulness and obedience to give over the years, we have seen miracle after miracle transform the House of Hope from a mere dream into a living reality for our children.
