PLEASE JOIN OUR SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

We need individuals, families, and groups to partner with us in bringing help and hope to African children. **You can help make a difference!** The sponsorship program is intended to achieve two important objectives:

First, it connects each child with a loving supportive sponsor committed to praying regularly for that child. Second, the program helps fund a portion of the on-going expenses associated with the care that the "JESUS. Hobbs House of Hope" provides our children.

How does the sponsorship program work?

The child sponsorship program is intended to be a blessing both to the child and the sponsor.

We ask our sponsors to:

- Pray regularly and consistently for their sponsored child. The House of Hope can help with the child's physical needs and can provide education and support, but only the Lord can heal the child's broken heart and spirit.
- Contribute a minimum of \$30 per month to the Mercy Foundation to help pay for the ongoing cost of caring for the child.

The cost for each child's food, shelter, clothing, education and medical care is \$6 per day. We realize that \$180 per month is a lot for one family to commit, therefore, our Sponsorship Program assigns multiple sponsors to each child. If you are able to contribute more than the \$30 minimum on a monthly basis, it would be greatly appreciated.

Making Sponsorship Payments


The preferred and most convenient way to pay for sponsorship is online by setting up a recurring automatic monthly withdrawal from your credit card. You can also give monthly, quarterly, or annually by check, cash, or money order.

100% of your sponsorship contribution goes directly to providing care and support for needy children.

Getting Started



3 CHILDREN NEED PRAYER

Muslim life before JHHH ...



Amina, Juma and Imran, three of our seven children from Muslim background, are no longer living at the House of Hope. Their grandmother has been insisting that we institute Muslim teaching for the children. Peter Njao, the JHHH Project Manager, told her back during the interview process, that we will be strictly teaching Christianity and that she needs to agree with that in order for us to take the children, which she did. But apparently over this past year she has been pressured by her Muslim leaders (Imams) to make sure they are taught Islamic regulations. So when she came to the Christmas party for the children, she took them back to her shack in the slums of Nairobi. The Imams threatened Peter saying that if he comes to retrieve them he will regret it. Peter went back to the grandmother pleading with her to do what's best for the kids. She acknowledged that the JHHH was best, but explained she has no other recourse. Amina, Juma and Imran cried as they were taken away.
