Most learners from pre-school all the way to class 8 have developed a yearning towards computer literacy. So far we've done two packages with the students: Introduction to Computers and Microsoft Word. The progress is impressive considering the achievements displayed on the two packages. JHHH'S GROWTH AND STRATEGIC LOCATION LEADS TO IMMEDIATE NEED FOR ADDITIONAL HOUSING

The Lord has blessed us in so many ways over these past nine years! One of those was by placing JHHH in a (previously unforeseen) strategic location, in Kajiado County. (Read full story in 'A Personal Word' on back.)

The Kenyan newspaper, Daily Nation, recently reported that "a fact sheet compiled by the Commission for Revenue Allocation named Kajiado County 'the richest county', out of 47 counties in Kenya."

The significance of this news is that these families in our area have the means to provide an excellent education for their children, and many are choosing the JESUS. Hobbs House of Hope School. **The Lord is using these neighboring families, by means of their paid boarding fees, to help supplement orphans who otherwise would not have a chance to live in a home, nor have the means to pay for a proper education. And that is the primary goal of JHHH, to rescue orphans.** We are a private Christian school, so these kids will also be raised in a Christian environment!

Our predicament is that we do not have space to accommodate these potential boarders and subsequent impoverished children. That is why, after much prayer, we sense God leading us to build additional housing.

Personal Word from Kristi Hobbs ... From Tribal Land to Techno City

“God appointed the times set for them and the exact places where they should live.” Acts 17:26

Nine years ago, when the Lord spoke to me and Peter and Jemimah Njao to build a children's home in Africa in memory of Billy, the search for property began. God led the Njao to five rural acres in the middle of Maasai tribal land. At that time, in 2006, nothing but tribal men herding their cattle could be seen for miles. The nearest town, Kitengela, was 15 miles away and so insignificant that it wasn't even on the map.

BUT GOD knew the end from the beginning. Within a few short years, Kitengela has become one of the fastest growing cities in Kenya, and its county, Kajiado, one of the wealthiest.

Kajiado has been dubbed 'the bedroom of Nairobi' due to the fact that Kenyans who make their living in the capital city of Nairobi, are choosing to live away from the hustle and bustle. They are now building their homes in this area which is 30 miles southwest of the capital. The Kenyan government also has plans for Kajiado County. In the near future 'Konza Techno City', a technological city likened to Silicon Valley will be built within a few miles of our property.

Our vision for the JHHH children since its inception has been that they will become the next leaders of Kenya. We pray that these once forsaken, discarded children, will influence the Nation to the Glory of God. Who knows but if the Lord didn't "appoint this exact place where they should live" to achieve this very purpose!
