




HELP US BUILD A NEW SCHOOL, AND HELP BUILD NEW LIVES

Personal word from Kristi Hobbs ... A timely Word at a critical moment

Every now and then I become overwhelmed by the magnitude of what God has called me to, particularly in Africa, specifically in regards to the Hobbs House of Hope. One such time was on March 23. I was at the JHHH Children's Home, and after a few days of meetings with our African technical consortium of architects, engineers and accountants the burden was great. Doubt began to set in, as it does periodically, and thoughts of "God, what were you thinking when you chose me? I don't know anything about construction or electricity or raising the necessary funds to do all that You have planned for this place." I decided that instead of a pity party I needed a good dose of the Presence and Voice of the Lord, so I took my Bible and climbed the stairs to the top of the newly constructed classrooms 1 and 2 of our school.

As I began to pour out my heart to the Lord, with all its doubts and fears, He reminded me of a verse given on November 11, 2006 while I was in Africa for the ground breaking of our first building at JHHH, I Samuel 7:12 "Thus far has the Lord helped us." That seemed to calm my fears a bit, but quite honestly my next thought was, 'Ok, Lord, thus far you have helped but what about from now on?' I turned in my Bible to that verse and as I flipped the pages, my eyes fell upon another previously highlighted verse, I Samuel 1216 "Now then, stand still and see this great thing the Lord is about to do before your eyes!" It was as if the Lord was audibly speaking this truth to my spirit. I heard it, I felt it, and I believed it! As my eyes were closed in prayer, thankful that the

same God who has helped thus far, will do greater things before my eyes, I heard footsteps. Looking up, there stood little Billy Omollo, apparently having followed me up to the roof. All of a sudden I got a glimpse of a 'great thing' the Lord has already done standing there before my eyes. He knelt down and began to scribble in my journal. I quickly grabbed my phone and snapped this picture. I then grabbed Billy and embraced him, thanking the Lord as tears flowed down my cheeks. In that moment, my perspective changed. No longer was I weighed down by the calling, but was grateful for it!
